
Friday 21st October – Break up for half-term

- Once students have researched the topic, the work they produce earns them accreditation with an AQA credit.

ASPIRE

Skills Builder:

The focus for our students this term is the skill of Speaking. Students present all their topic work at the end of the term and are awarded a grade in accordance with the GCSE English Spoken Language mark scheme. In addition to this this, students take part in various interactive activities such as art and craft which promote their oracy skills.

Work Placements:

We have two of our students working with Active Travel Hub. They are helping to fix and maintain bikes and are really enjoying the role. We also have students working in construction, glass and with Active Fusion.



TEACHING AND LEARNING

The curriculum is designed with a hook of a history topic and this goes in chronological order. The text that students read for English Language are from an exam board and are all linked to a historical topic. Year 10 focus is currently Castles with year 11 on World War One. Maths work starts with a link to the topic so that students can see how maths is linked to the real world, they then go on to follow the maths GCSE course. English Literature lessons look at texts and poems that were written at the time of the topic. We investigate Science by researching discoveries that were made during the time period of the topic. Our practical activities have included building castles and trenches.
