ASPIRE

Skills Builder:

The focus for our students this term is the skill of Speaking. Students are set an individual speaking target to help them build their communication skills. In addition to this, students take part in various interactive activities such as art and crafts and team building activities to improve their verbal and non-verbal skills.

Work Placements:

A very successful half term with students working hard in their work placements. We have currently 11 different employers supporting our students within a range of fields such as construction, glass and carpet fitting, education and hair and beauty. Students are receiving positive feedback from their placements with some receiving gifts of appreciation for their hard work.

TEACHING AND LEARNING

This half term the Year 10 topic is the Tudors and Year 11 the Spanish Civil War. Students have completed an independent research project on Henry VIII and Thomas Cromwell and Year 11 Spanish culture. This has earned them an AQA Credit. Students have been introduced to poetry that was written during the time period of their topic. They have compared poems for similarities and differences. The scientific discoveries from the time periods studied include the work of Sir Isaac Newton and Alexander Fleming. All GCSE core subjects are linked to the topic. We have recently introduced PSHE to the curriculum and have so far looked at emotions and how to stay mentally, physically, and socially healthy.
